**Leisure and hospitality led the month-over growth with 1,000 jobs**

The unemployment rate in Fresno County was 5.8 percent in June 2022, up from a revised 5.3 percent in May 2022, and below the year-ago estimate of 10.0 percent. This compares with an unadjusted unemployment rate of 4.0 percent for California and 3.8 percent for the nation during the same period.

**Between May 2022 and June 2022**, total industry employment increased by 400 jobs (up 0.1 percent) to total 422,800. Nonfarm employment rose by 900 jobs (up 0.2 percent), while farm employment dropped by 500 jobs (down 1.0 percent).

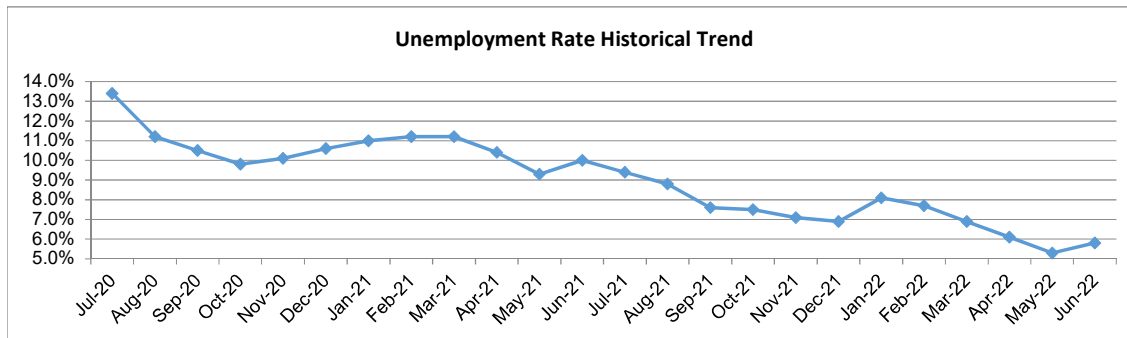
- Leisure and hospitality posted the largest month-over gain with the addition of 1,000 jobs. Accommodation and food services accounted for 90 percent of the job gain (up 900).
- Three industry sectors registered employment gains of 200 jobs each: manufacturing, professional and business services, and trade, transportation, and utilities.
- Information experienced an increase of 100 jobs.
- Meanwhile, farm employment recorded the largest month-over decline with a drop of 500 jobs.

**Between June 2021 and June 2022**, total industry employment increased by 18,100 jobs (up 4.5 percent). Nonfarm employment rose by 16,200 jobs (up 4.5 percent), and farm employment added 1,900 jobs (up 4.1 percent).

- Educational and health services posted the largest year-over increase of 4,900 jobs. Health care and social assistance increased by 4,800 and educational services rose by 100 jobs.
- Trade, transportation, and utilities climbed up by 3,200 jobs. Wholesale trade added 1,200 jobs, transportation, warehousing, and utilities also increased by 1,200 jobs, and retail trade grew by 800 jobs.
- Leisure and hospitality reported an additional 2,600 jobs compared to a year ago. Accommodation and food services accounted for approximately 96 percent of the job gain (up 2,500).
- Farm employment reported a year-over increase of 1,900 jobs.
- Government expanded payrolls by 1,800 jobs since June 2021. Gains in local government (up 2,500 jobs), and state government (up 400 jobs), offset a decline of 1,100 jobs in federal government.
